HOW TO BUY

The Livestock Sale will be held in the Ron Marhofer Livestock Barn and is open to everyone. Interested bidders need to register and if this is your first time at the sale you will need a current drivers license to complete your registration. The sale catalog contains information regarding the official sale weight, pen or tag number, club and the owner of each animal. For large livestock, bids are made in dollars and cents per pound with the animal going to the highest bidder. Small animals they are sold by the pen. All bids and sales are final. If you need help in bidding, assistants at the auction will be glad to help.

I CANT MAKE THE SALE BUT I STILL WANT TO BUY

If you are unable to attend the auction, yet wish to purchase an animal, you may do so by filling out a Purchase Authorization Agreement. The Auction Committee can assist you as a proxy buyer. Contact the auction sale committee staff (see below) for absentee bidding. Payment is desired at the Auction to ensure timely payment to the youth exhibitors. You will be authorizing us to charge your card up to the amount you wish to purchase.

YOU HAD A WINNING BID WHATS NEXT?

Check out is completed at the sale office registration table. Payment is due at checkout to ensure timely payment to the youth exhibitors. All animals must go to a licensed processor per Ohio law. For large livestock at the time of payment you will have to pick your choice of processor (list is below). Your processor of choice will contact you within a few days to discuss custom cutting options. Processing fees for large livestock are NOT included in your bid at the livestock sale. For small livestock poultry and rabbit, your processing is included and there is not a choice of processors. Small animals are whole there are no cutting options. The following forms of payment are accepted: CASH, CHECK OR CREDIT CARD

If you choose to purchase a small animal and donate the meat to a local pantry or shelter, the 4-H club and/or Jr. Fair Livestock committee will make arrangements for your purchase to be delivered to the local pantry or shelter.
